MEDICATION: Each year when school ends, we ask parents to please come and pick up any medications, EpiPens, inhalers, breathing machines or any other medications they may have in our Lighthouse office. These items need to

be signed out with Mrs. Gerlach no later than Thursday, June 13th, or it will be discarded. No medications are kept throughout the summer. New medical forms and medications are needed at the beginning of each school year and can be found online. If you would like to pick up new paper forms, you may do so when you pick up your child's medication from the current school year.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: We have had several families move to new homes within the past couple of months. Many of these families have chosen to continue to bring their chil-


dren to Lighthouse to finish out the school year. This practice of finishing the school year is allowed, however if a family has moved within the district or outside of the school district we need to know about the new address. If the new address is outside of the Lighthouse school boundaries, the families must fill out a "School of Choice" form in order to have the children continue their education at Lighthouse Elementary. Please make sure that the office is notified of any change in addresses.

ARRIVAL: School starts at 9:00 am, the building doors will be opened at 8:50 AM. There is no supervision before this time and students should not be dropped off without parent supervision in the morning.

DISMISSAL: is officially 3:51 pm. Young 5 and Kindergarten students are dismissed at 3:45 pm. Please remember students must be supervised both before and after school by a parent or adult. SAC caregivers are NOT responsible for supervising children who are not enrolled in the SAC program or on the playground.

PARENT PICK UP LOT: We are asking parents to remain in cars when possible and follow the "loop" to drop students off or pick them up directly in front of Door #10. This will help us make sure that all students are safe and the traffic flow can be managed. As an alternative, parents can park in a designated parking spot and walk their child up to the door or pick them up from Door #10. Students should NOT be crossing through the parking lot without supervision or adult assistance. Thank you all for your support and assistance!
