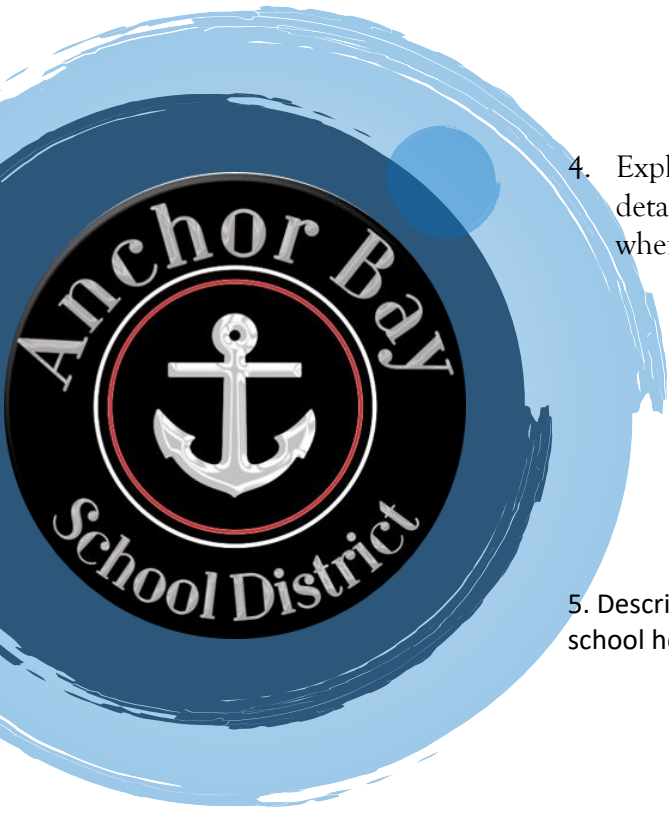

Students will complete weekly leadership assignments, read about and research effective leaders, and practice speaking skills. As a major focus of the class, students will plan, implement, and evaluate service projects. Examples of past events include: Kindness Week, Holiday Giving Tree, Macomb Animal Shelter Supply Drive, and Dollar-for-Flower. Through this practice, students will be challenged to understand leadership and to identify a path to becoming an effective leader.
