



Important Testing Information:

All 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students will participate in testing during the month of April. Testing dates are as follows:

Wednesday, April 10th : SAT (11th grade) and PSAT 10 (10th grade) Thursday, April 11th : ACT (11th grade) and PSAT 9 (9th grade) Week of April 15th : M-STEP (11th grade)

Please note that completing the MME suite of assessments is a graduation requirement.

In preparation for testing, students will need to complete a Digital Readiness Check (DRC). Included in the DRC is an opportunity to sign up for Big Future School and Connections. Big Future School is a free mobile app that lets students view their scores and get customized career information and guidance about planning and paying for college. Available through the Big Future School app, ConnectionsTM is a free program exclusively for school day test takers that allows them to hear from nonprofit colleges and scholarship programs that may be a good match.

If you would prefer that your student not sign up for Big Future School and Connections, please fill out the opt out form below. Filling out the form allows you to opt your student out of providing optional information that is not directly related to the administration of these assessments.

STUDENTS SIGNING OUT 🕷



When a parent or guardian gives permission for their student to leave school for emergency or medical appointments, the following must be adhered to for dismissal:

- 1. If parent/quardian is picking the student up, the parent needs to come into the building (I.D. is required) and sign the student out.
- 2. If the student has a vehicle at school the Parent/guardian can call the counseling office and speak to a secretary. A secretary will then call the student out of class, sign them out, and give them a pass.
- 3. Parents can write a note stating date, time, reason for student to be released, and a phone number where they can be reached. The note must be brought to the counseling office before school in the morning. The secretary will then call the parent to confirm the note and times indicated. PARENTS WILL BE CALLED ON ALL NOTES FOR THE SAFETY OF YOUR SON/ DAUGHTER. If we are unable to get in contact with the parent to confirm note, your student will be unable to be released. Once we have contacted parents and an excused pass has been written, it is the student's responsibility to come to the office to get the pass before he/she leaves the campus. If he/she leaves without signing out in the office, the student will be unexcused.

ABHS CLOSED CAMPUS POLICY

We have a closed campus policy at Anchor Bay High School which means that students are required to stay in school during lunch hour. Student may not exit the cafeteria during lunch without permission since classes are in session.

STUDENT BOOK DEBTS

Please remind your student that when he/she is assigned a textbook that they return the book to the teacher who issued it to them. Students will sign their initials upon receipt and return of their textbooks. This will ensure that your student will not obtain a book debt at the end of the school year.

REMEMBER, YOU'RE NOT JUST GETTING RID OF WEEDS AND PESTS

Did you know you can protect your kids, pets and the environment from the harmful effects of herbicides and pesticides by choosing earth-friendly landscaping? The chemicals in herbicides and pesticides pollute our waterways, if washed from our lawns and gardens into storm drains that lead directly to our lakes and rivers.

So what can you do to help? Simple. Follow these tips for simple ways you can care for your lawn and garden and help keep our water clean.

- **Go native**. Select plants native to Michigan. Native plants are better able to tolerate Michigan's climate, require less fertilizer and water and are more disease resistant. Native plants also attract butterflies and birds.
- Variety is the spice of life. Use a wide variety of plants to help control pests and minimize the need for pesticides.
- Water wisely. Lawns need about one inch of water per week. Over-watering results in shallowrooted plants that are less tolerant of heat and drought, and more prone to disease. Use a rain gauge and water only when necessary, instead of on a fixed schedule.
- Use mulch. Place a thick layer of mulch (4") around trees and plants. This helps retain water, reduce weeds and minimizes the need for pesticides.
- Mow high. Make you lawn cheaper and easier to maintain by mowing high-3" is the rule. Tall grass promotes root growth and shades out weeds. Let grass clipping fall back on the lawn. Clippings recycle nutrients back into the soil, so fertilizer needs can be reduced by 25% or more!
- Rake it or leave it. Follow your community's leaf pick-up guidelines. Avoid raking leaves into storm drains or roadside ditches that lead to our lakes and rivers because decaying leaves use up water's oxygen and harm fish and aquatic insects. Try mowing leaves into your lawn-they also make a good fertilizer.
- Use less for pests. Use pesticides and herbicides sparingly. Limit application of these chemicals to problem areas only and help protect your kids, pets and the environment.
