

Honors Academy Structure

- The Honors Academy is organized in smaller learning communities by grade level.
- Students can still pursue elective courses, CTE courses, and extracurricular activities.
- The master schedule starts with the Honors Academy students.



Honors Academy Courses

- Students work within a cohort with the same teachers who coordinate lessons and field trips.
- Teachers collaborate test dates within the cohort to minimize the number of tests on a given day.
- The Academy provides a rigorous academic curriculum that prepares students to be successful in Advanced Placement courses and college.

Honors Academy Courses

- The Honors Academy is designed for students to pursue advanced courses and to become both college and career ready.
- Honors and AP Courses boost GPA allowing students to stand out in the college admission process and prepare students for college courses.

Honors Course +.50 GPA Boost per class per semester AP Course +1.0 GPA Boost per class per semester

• Students who complete the Honors Academy earn recognition during graduation and receive an Honors Academy Diploma.



Advanced Placement Courses

- AP courses are rigorous courses taught at the college level and are concluded by a comprehensive exam.
- The exams are written by the College Board and scored on a five-point scale. College credit may be awarded to students who score a 3 or higher on AP exams.
- Students can earn up to 20 or more Advanced Placement credits- possible to save up 1 year college costs -\$20,000.

• Advanced placement scores are recognized at more than 3,200 colleges and universities.



Courses Available - 9th Grade

- Honors Intro to American Literature
- Honors U.S. History
- Honors Geometry*
- Honors Biology

Fifteen of twenty-four classes will be at an Honors or AP level.

*Students must double up in math if they did not take Algebra I in 8th grade.



Courses Available - 10th Grade

- Honors Western Literature
- AP or Honors World History
- Honors Algebra II
- Honors Chemistry/Honors Physics



Courses Available - 11th Grade

- AP Language & Composition
- AP U.S. Government

- Honors Pre-Calculus or Pre-Calculus
- AP Chemistry or other approved science course.



Courses Available – 12th Grade

- AP Literature
- AP U.S. History

HONORS CTE OPTIONS

- CTE Career Technical Education and partnership with Honors Academy
- Anchor Bay has 16 state approved programs.

• These programs are also for college-bound students that would like to explore career options while taking high school classes.



HONORS CTE OPTIONS

- Students can participate in local and state competitions and win awards and medals. Great for college applications.
 Students can participate in HOSA, DECA, BPA.
- Anchor Bay's CTE programs include: Medical Education, Business Management, Finance, Graphic Arts, Engineering, Computer Programming, Marketing, Cybersecurity, Culinary Arts, Web Design, Teacher Cadet, Broadcasting, JROTC, Auto, Construction Trades, and Horticulture.
- All CTE courses are eligible for articulation credits.
