Reward trips are part of our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program. They are designed to encourage positive behavior and academic success. The following trips are planned for the 2023-24 school year for students who meet the qualifying standards.

To qualify for our PBIS Reward Trips, students must meet the criteria established in our student code of conduct.

"A student receiving a total of six (6) demerit points will be excluded from the school trip program. Any student involved in a fight, instigating a fight or referred for a major infraction of a violent nature will be excluded from the school trip program."

Green Team and MJHS Have Teamed Up to Help Feed the Bay A donation box will be in the commons at Anchor Bay Middle School North to collect shoe donations. We will be collecting shoes for the Shoe Drive until March 1st.

Have you cleaned out your closet lately? Those shoes that have been sitting there unworn, actually have value! We're collecting gently worn, used and new shoes and we need your help. We're looking for all sizes and all types of shoes: sneakers, boots, dress shoes, sandals, athletic, dance shoes and casual shoes. We want them all! (No boots that clip into skis or snowboards, please.)

Our goal is 2,500 pairs of shoes. If we collect 2,500 pairs of shoes, we can earn \$1,000 for Feed the Bay. The more shoes we collect, the more money we earn for Feed the Bay. Plus, we will keep all of those shoes out of landfills.

All donated shoes will be redistributed to microenterprise partners through Funds2Orgs, a for profit social enterprise, and used in developing nations for impoverished people to start their own businesses.

In the US alone, over 600 million pairs of shoes are thrown away per year. The materials used to manufacture a pair of shoes are created from chemical compounds that will create health hazards if left to disintegrate openly or in landfills. We checked the reports that are issued by "School Messenger" and found that many of the text messages (SMS) were being reported as BLOCKED. This means that when you received a text message from School Messenger (number: 68453) during the initial set up, no response was sent back. School Messenger assumes that you DO NOT want text messages if they do not receive a response. To correct this, please do the following: If you would like to receive text messages from Anchor Bay School District, send a text message to (68453) with the words "opt in" or "subscribe" as the message. If you are already receiving text message from Anchor Bay School District no further


## SendMoneytoSchool is Now Family Portal


#### Instructions for Parent to view Report Card.

#### DRESS CODE

Guidelines shall prohibit student dress or grooming practices which:

Present a hazard to the health or safety to himself/herself or to other in school.

Interfere with schoolwork, create disorder, or disrupt the educational program.

Cause excessive ware or damage to school property

Prevent the student from achieving his/her education objectives because of blocked vision or restricted movement.

A few examples of inappropriate attire include:

Bare midriff or backless tops (you should not be able to see bellybuttons or any skin on your stomach or back)

Short shorts, short skirts

Profane, negative or obscene writing or pictures

Hats (no head cover), sunglasses

Coats or jackets designed for outerwear

Tank tops or transparent tops (shirts must have sleeves completely covering the outside point of the shoulders). No low cut or revealing dress or tops revealing cleavage.

Baggy tops revealing shoulder and/or straps (shirts must have sleeves completely covering the outside point of the shoulders). Clothing that has reference to drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex, gangs, or illegal activities may not be worn.

Clothing of appropriate size and worn in proper locations – no sagging of the pants. Pants should not drag on the floor; a belt is recommended. Cuffs should be no wider than 8 inches.

Wallet Chains, spiked jewelry, or other dangerous accessories.

Visible tattoos, excessive writing on the skin (no face painting)

Shoes, sandals, or boots must be worn at all times

Breakaway clothing, snap pants, pajamas. Student dress and grooming should be clean and in good taste.

#### Protecting Our Water...It's as Easy as Seven Simple Steps

Did you know that over three million people depend on our lakes and streams for their drinking water? And that in Southeast Michigan there are over 300,000 registered boaters and 3.5 million people visit a local park each year?

With this many people depending on our lakes and streams for drinking water and recreation, we need to be careful how we treat our water. You might not be able to see the stream or lake from your house, but it's there. It might be a small stream or ditch or even a storm drain in the street. All of these leads directly to our lakes and streams. So, what we do at home effects our water!

Here are seven simple steps you can take in your home and yard to protect our lakes and streams

- 1. **Help keep pollution out of storm drains.** Storm drains lead directly to our lakes and streams. So, never dump oil, pet waste, leaves, dirty water, or anything down a storm drain. Remember, only rain in the drain.
- 2. **Fertilize caringly and sparingly.** Excess fertilizer that gets into storm drains pollutes our lakes by causing large algae blooms and using up oxygen fish need to survive. Sweep excess fertilizer back onto your lawn, use a low or no phosphorus fertilizer, and have your soil tested to see what, if any, fertilizer is needed.
- 3. Carefully store and dispose of household cleaners, chemicals and oil. Instead of putting hazardous products like antifreeze, motor oil and pesticides in the trash, down the storm drain or on the ground, take them to a local hazardous waste collection day.
- 4. **Clean up after your pet.** Whether on a walk or in your yard, promptly clean up after your pet. Not only will you be a good neighbor, you will also protect our water from harmful bacteria.
- 5. **Practice good car care.** Consider taking your car to a car wash or washing your car on the grass.
- 6. **Choose earth friendly landscaping**. Protect your pets, kids and environment by using pesticides sparingly. Also, water your lawn only when it needs it and choose plants native to Michigan.
- 7. **Save water.** Over watering our lawns can easily carry pollution to the storm drains and to our lakes and streams. Consider using a broom instead of a hose to clean · sidewalks and driveways. Direct hoses and sprinklers on the lawn, not the driveway. This will help save our lakes and streams and save you money.

# Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days of school a month, over the course of the school year, can drastically affect a student's academic success.

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO

#### Make school attendance a priority

- · Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- · Help your children maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- · Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- If your children must stay home because they are sick, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

#### Help your teen stay engaged

- Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your children are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you child's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage your child to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- Notice and support your children if they are showing signs of anxiety, such as headaches
  or stomach aches. Listen to their concerns, and if needed, ask school staff for help.

#### Communicate with the school

- Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties.
- · Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- Seek help from school staff, other parents, or community agencies if you need support.
