Character Strengths Overview


Character strengths — as classified by positive psychology — are a family of positive traits expressed through a person's thoughts, feelings, and behaviors that are universally recognized for the strength that they create in individuals and communities.

Making children aware that every one of them has all 24 <u>character strengths</u>, provides the foundation for genuine self-confidence grounded in self-awareness. At the same time, it helps children better understand why everyone is different and how to appreciate those differences.

Unlike our height, weight, or skin color, character strengths aren't something that can't be seen with the naked eye. Therefore, understanding and valuing them — <u>especially in other people</u> — requires a framework of consistent reflection and discussion.

By consistently teaching our youth about the character strengths that everyone possesses, they will see people based on the content of their character. This ability will enhance their self-awareness and self-confidence, understanding and appreciation of others, and <u>interpersonal relationships</u> – which will positively influence our youth (individually and collectively) across their lifespans.

Ranging from bravery and creativity to integrity and gratitude, <u>positive psychology's 24 character strengths</u> are the foundation of The Positivity Project's model.
