### Please have the following with you at the time of your registration. Items will be uploaded during online enrollment.

- Original Certified Birth Certificate
- **Immunization Records**
- Parent/Guardian Identification (Driver's License)
- Proof of Residency: Two pieces of proof are required. Each piece must have parent/guardian name, address and must be current (current or previous month). Proof may be a purchase agreement, mortgage statement, property tax statement or utility bills.
- Student's most recent report card or transcript
- Discipline record from prior school Required for Schools of Choice students
- Current IEP (Special Education only) or 504 plan
- Kindergarten only: Vision, Dental, and Hearing Screening report
- Completed enrollment forms. Buildings will have copies available if you are unable to access them online.
