# SchoolMessenger\*

We found that several parents were not receiving text messages from the District notifying them of school cancellation. We checked the reports that are issued by "School Messenger" and found that many of the text messages (SMS) were being reported as BLOCKED. This means that when you received a text message from School Messenger (number: 68453) during the initial set up, no response was sent back. School Messenger assumes that you DO NOT want text messages if they do not receive a response. To correct this, please do the following:

### ACT WORK KEYS INFORMATION

Students can view their scores online and print their own National Career Readiness Certificate starting July 7, 2024 by creating their free account at myworkkeys.com (www.myworkkeys.com).

Students will provide the following five matching criteria when creating an account: First name, Last name, Month of birth, Day of birth & State Assigned Student ID Number (SASID). The SASID is the same as the student UIC number.

#### **Important SPRING 2025 Testing Information:**

State-mandated testing will begin the week of April 7th (SAT w/Essay, ACT Work Keys, PSAT 10 & PSAT 9). Please use this information to plan vacations around this very important assessment time for your student(s). Juniors (11) will complete the Michigan Merit Exam. (MME). The MME has three components: the SAT with Essay, the ACT Work Keys, and the M-Step (Science & Social Studies). Completion of all components is required for graduation from ABHS.





The Performing Arts Center's fall production of *The Curious Savage* ran November 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, and 16<sup>th</sup>. We had a wonderful time and truly appreciate our audiences and all of the help our program received in preparing for and presenting our show. Thank you to all of our students, parents, staff, and community for their support, and congratulations to all of the students who worked so diligently on our production.

The Performing Arts Center is now preparing for another show: the Michigan Interscholastic Forensics Association's (MIFA) One Act Theatre Festival—a show that travels to other schools and is rated on a scale of I to III and may advance to state level competition with other schools. Each year, Anchor Bay places well in the festival and has qualified for state-level competition many times in years past. We hope to do so again this year. The genre for this year is serious, and the title of our show is *Back Cover* by Emily Hageman. Auditions will occur the week after Thanksgiving break on Tuesday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>; Wednesday December 4<sup>th</sup>, from 2:30 until 5:30 pm, with callbacks, if needed, scheduled for Thursday December 5<sup>th</sup>. The cast list will be posted on Friday, December 6<sup>th</sup> at the end of the high school day. The festivals are open to the public and scheduled to occur Saturdays, January 11<sup>th</sup> or 18<sup>th</sup> for Love Fest or Districts and February 1<sup>st</sup> for Regionals, though the sites for each of these festivals is yet to be determined. The state festival will occur Friday and Saturday, February 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> at Wayne State University; whether Anchor Bay qualifies or not, it is a tremendously, talent-filled and entertaining event that should be attended by all who appreciate the theatre. Hope you can attend!

Pre-production meetings for the spring musical production will be held in mid- February. Please watch for announcements and attend one of the pre-production meetings for more information.

On the forensics front, Anchor Bay's forensics team is also preparing to travel to the Punxatourney Tournament on January 25<sup>th</sup> to compete at the MIFA season opener being hosted by Holt High School. ### SCHOLARSHIP SCAMS

If you have to pay money to get money, it's probably a scam. Every year students and parents are defrauded by scholarship scams. Scam operations often imitate legitimate government agencies, grant-giving foundations, education lenders and scholarships matching services, using official-sounding names containing words like "National", "Federal," "Foundation" or "Administration."

Visit:www.finaid.org/scholarships/scams.phtml to learn how to identify such scholarship scams. In general, be wary of scholarships with an application fee, scholarship matching services that guarantee success, advance-fee loan scams and sales pitches disguised as financial aid

# TAKE A LOOK AT SEVERAL COLLEGES WHEN LOOKING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

If you need scholarship help to attend college, don't limit yourself by applying to just one or two schools. Competitive universities usually don't come knocking on your door offering scholarship monies like some of our other fine universities in Michigan. Many of them offer generous packages that are based on merit, not need. Students looking for scholarship help should apply to several schools to see which ones may offer help. Go to the colleges' websites to look at their scholarship offerings. Aggressive, timely research by students and parents is essential in the scholarship search. # STUDENTS SIGNING OUT 🕷

#### REMEMBER, YOU'RE NOT JUST WASHING YOUR CAR

Did you know there are over four million vehicles in Southeast Michigan? With that many cars and trucks, we all need to practice good car care to protect our lakes and streams.

How does caring for your car affect our waterways? Storm drains found in our streets and roadside ditches lead directly to our lakes and streams. If dirty water from washing our cars gets into the storm drain, it pollutes our local waterways. This "dirty" water contains pollutants such as grease as dirt, and the soap itself contains phosphorus, which can lead to excessive algae growth in our lakes.

What can you do? Simple.

- Make a date. Car-wash facilities treat their dirty water before discharging it to our lakes and streams. So, make a date to take your car to a car wash.
- Wash it-on the grass. If you wash your car at home, consider washing it on the lawn. The lawn will gladly soap up the soapy, dirty water preventing it from entering storm drains or road-side ditches. If you can't use the lawn, try to direct the dirty water towards the lawn and away from the storm drain.

Minimize it. Reduce the amount of soap you use or wash your can with plain water.
