Thursday, October 31, 2024, is Halloween. Staff and students who wish to participate by dressing in costume may do so on Thursday only. Please be mindful of the following guidelines.

- 1. The normal school dress code will be enforced. As is typical, we will not allow low cut tops, bare midriffs, and/or tank tops
- 2. No masks or other face coverings will be allowed
- 3. No "look-alike" weapons will be allowed
- 4. Costumes containing sexual innuendoes, or those promoting alcohol, drugs, violence or anything construed to be offensive in nature will not be allowed
- 5. For their own safety, students should avoid wearing costumes that drag on the floor
- 6. Roller blades, skates, scooters, skateboards or any type of propelling equipment will not be allowed
- 7. Hats and sweatshirt hoods may be worn that day provided they are identified as part of the costume

Students dressing inappropriately will be asked to change and could be subject to further disciplinary action. The administrative team will make final judgments should questions regarding the appropriateness of a student's dress arise. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

Safety first and always! Whether students are taking the bus, riding a bicycle, driving by car, or walking to school, students and parents need to be equally aware of making sure everyone travels safely to and from school. If you are dropping off or picking up your student, it is imperative that you adhere to the guidelines for drop off and pick up. I thank everyone ahead of time for your patience, vigilance, and cautiousness now and all year long as we help each other keep our students and drivers safe each day.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

If you drive your child to or from school, you will need to drive to the main parking lot. When you are dropping off your child, please pull all the way up to the last sign that is on the sidewalk. This keeps the traffic pattern flowing and traffic back-ups to a minimum. You may also drop off your child in the parking lot along Ashley Street. **Do not drive in the bus loop to drop your child off**. Safety is the number one concern when driving around the school property.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Anchor Bay North offers Academic Support for our students on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday every week from 3 to 4pm. Students report to the Media Center immediately after school. 
SendMoneytoSchool is Now Family Portal

Protecting Our Water...

Remember, you're not just walking the dog.

Did you know that pet waste contains bacteria that makes our lakes and rivers unsafe for swimming and other recreational activities?

... There are over 53 million dogs in the United States, which produce 6.3 billion pounds of waste and bacteria per year?

... Residential lawns and streets are among the highest contributors of bacteria in storm water, which drains directly to our lakes and rivers?

Southeast Michigan loves dogs, too. Nearly one-third of the region's households have at least one dog. Most of us pick after our pets to be good neighbors and keep our yards clean. But there's another important reason to clean up after our pets. Leaving pet waste on the sidewalk or in the yard means that harmful bacterial can get washed into storm drains and roadside ditches and then flow directly into our lakes and rivers untreated,

What can you do? Simple. No matter where you are, dispose of your pet's waste promptly by throwing it in the trash or toilet.

DRESS CODE

Anchor Bay Schools respect students' right to express themselves in the way they dress. All students who attend Anchor Bay Schools are expected to respect the school community by dressing appropriately for the K-12 environment. Student attire should facilitate participation in the learning and health and safety of students and adults who supervise them. This policy is intended to guide students, staff, and parents.

The following guidelines shall be followed, which allow for student expression but also to aid in academic success and safety.

Guidelines shall prohibit student dress or grooming practices which:

- 1. Presents a hazard to the health and safety of the student or to others in the school.
- 2. Interfere with schoolwork, create disorder, or disrupt the educational program.
- 3. Cause excessive wear or damage to school property.
- 4. Prevent the student from achieving educational objectives because of blocked vision or restricted movement.

Inappropriate attire includes:

Profane, negative, or obscene writing or pictures

Sunglasses (unless prescription transitional lenses)

Hoods, or anything that covers the ears

Tube tops or single strap tops. Tops must have a strap on both shoulders

Transparent clothing

Clothing that reveals undergarments

Clothing that exposes nipples, genitals, or buttocks

Clothing that has references to drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex, gangs, illegal activities, demonstrates association—with hate groups, or uses hate speech targeting a protected class — may not be worn.

Footwear with a sole must be worn at all times.

Students who represent the district at an official or school sponsored function or public event (I.E. – athletic teams, band, choir, AFJROTC, etc.) may be required to follow specific dress requirements as a condition of participation or attendance. Specialized courses may require specialized attire such as sports uniforms or safety gear. I.E.- Physical Education and Career and Technical classes.

The administration at each school reserves the right to determine what constitutes appropriate dress.

Any student with inappropriate clothing will remain in the office until an appropriate solution is found. This may require a change of clothing to be brought to the school.



Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

DID YOU KNOW?

- · Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days of school a month, over the course of the school year, can drastically affect a student's academic success.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Make school attendance a priority

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- · Help your children maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- · Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- If your children must stay home because they are sick, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

Help your teen stay engaged

- · Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your children are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies.
 If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you child's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends
 can feel isolated.
- Encourage your child to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- Notice and support your children if they are showing signs of arxiety, such as headaches
 or stomach aches. Listen to their concerns, and if needed, ask school staff for help.

Communicate with the school

- Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties.
- . Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- · Seek help from school staff, other parents, or community agencies if you need support.
