CELL PHONE / DEVICE / TABLET REMINDER:



Taken from our District Handbook:

The district recognizes that cell phones have become a part of daily life. Many students have them, however, we would discourage students from bringing them to school. In the event that students are instructed by parents to bring them, they must be turned off and stored in lockers during the day. The district assumes no responsibility for theft, loss, damage or vandalism to wireless communication devise brought onto district property.

<u>All cell phones or devices should be OFF and in lockers.</u> It is EXTREMELY important for parents to continue to monitor their child's devices!

Cell phones can be useful when taught appropriately. Recommendations to block numbers and "limit group texting" at a young age.

Advice/Tips:

- Start Simple: Enter phone numbers, apps and limit full access.
- Limit Usage: Check periodically for any deleted texts and browser history.
- Exercise Etiquette: Enforce your own rules and make sure your child respects the expectations.
- **Designate times** for "talking/texting" after dinner, chores or homework.
- Have your elementary age child put the cell phone in a designated area at night for charging not in their bedroom.
- **On the Bus:** Students are permitted to use them <u>appropriately</u> (music, games quietly). NO PHOTOS OR TEXTING.


Officer Wilson will be meeting with the 3rd, 4th and 5th graders to talk about internet safety. Thank you for your support.
